### RECIPE FOR CLASS 76

#### LEMON BARS (Serves 16) (taken from Borthwick Water Recipe Book)

*6oz Plain Flour • 4oz Butter • 2oz Granulated Sugar • 7oz Caster Sugar • 2tbspns Plain Flour*

*1/2 tsp Baking Powder • 1/4 tspn salt • 2 Medium Eggs lightly beaten*

*Juice and finely grated rind 1 Lemon • Sifted Icing Sugar to decorate Lemon Bars*

Lightly oil and line a 20.5cm/8 inch square cake tin with greaseproof paper.

Rub together 6oz of the flour and the butter until the mixture resembles breadcrumbs, stir in the granulated sugar.

Turn the mixture into the prepared tin and press down firmly. Bake in a preheated oven at 170 C/ 325F/ Gas Mark 3. For 20 minutes until pale and golden.

Meanwhile in a food processor, mix together the caster sugar, 2oz flour, baking powder, salt, eggs lemon juice and grated rind until smooth. Pour over the prepared base.

Return to the oven and bake for a further 20-25 minutes until nearly set, perhaps a bit wobbly!

Remove, cool on a wire rack and dust with icing sugar, cut into 16 bars.

# RULES

- 1 The Society to be called "Roberton Show Society".
- 2 Exhibitors are restricted to 2 entries per class for Industrial Section only.
- 3 All Flowers and Vegetables must have been in the possession of Exhibitors at least 6 weeks previous to the day of the Show. **All vegetables must be washed and prepared for show table.**
- 4 Entries close - Sheep: Saturday 18th August 2018, Industrial: 10am on Show Day.
- 5 All Exhibits to be staged 8-10am. Sheep penned by 10am. Judging commences 10.30am. **This rule will be strictly enforced.**
- 6 All reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but the Committee will not be responsible for any loss or damage to any exhibit during or after the Show.
- 7 **No Exhibits or Sheep to be removed before 4.30pm. Any cut flowers left at the end of the Show will be donated to a local residential home for the elderly.**
- 8 South Country Cheviot, South Country Cheviot Undressed and Blackfaced classes confined to the following radius of Borthwick Valley, Linhope, Skelfhill, Priestthaugh, Southfield, Pilmuir, Crumhaughhill, Slitrig Valley, Bonchester-Hawick road, Martins House, Overhall, Wiltonburn, Whitfield, Calaburn, Whitehaugh, Greensidehall, Stouslie, Stirches Mains, Galalaw East and West Boonraw, Drinkstone, Outer Huntly, Essenside, Burnfoot Ale, Langhope Todrig, Redfordgreen, Drycleuchlee, Deloraineshiel, East Buccleuch, Ettrick Valley. Other sheep classes are open.
- 9 All first prize breeding sheep class winners are eligible for the championships.
- 10 Exhibitors may only show in one of the two Cheviot sections
- 11 It is the sheep exhibitors responsibility to ensure all necessary biosecurity precautions are taken prior, during and after the show.
- 12 Rare and Minority Breeds as per RBST Watchlist Category 3-6.

**NOTE:** In the event of **equal** points in any section the exhibitor with most **1st prize tickets** will be awarded the trophy.

**NOTE:** Competitors infringing the Rules are liable to forfeit any prizes gained. Committee's decision is final. The Committee reserve the right to refuse any entry.

**NOTE:** Vases are provided, but Exhibitors are requested to provide vases for Bouquets, etc, and bring their exhibits early on day of Show.

**NOTE:** Any prize money not collected on day of Show will be returned to Show funds.
